

## Joint Provider Policy

DNA welcomes the opportunity to jointly provide educational activities with other professional organizations when activities are congruent with the DNA mission and vision.

DNA must be engaged at the start of the planning process.

- Per ANCC standards, as an approved provider of continuing nursing education by ANCC, DNA is required to act as the provider of nursing continuing education credits. This means DNA is responsible for determining educational objectives and content for the educational activity.
- A DNA Nurse Planner must be on the planning committee and is responsible for ensuring adherence to DNA policies and ANCC accreditation criteria.
- A Joint Provider Agreement which outlines the responsibilities of DNA as the provider, the responsibilities of the joint provider(s) and any other accords must be signed prior to the start of the planning process.
